What happens to the phones?

Phones that are destined for re-use are sold around the world to be refurbished and sold back into global markets. During the refurbishment process the memory is flashed to erase all personal data. However, we always recommend that you clear out any sensitive data and remove your SIM card before you recycle your phone.
